Covenants pertaining to the land upon which 19 Marlborough Buildings was built.

The Freehold title of the land is subject to the following:

- a) To a perpetual yearly fee farm rent of eleven pounds (£11. Os. Od.) created by a conveyance dated 5th December 1787 made between John Fielder, James Broom and Thomas King of the first part; William Cross of the second part; and John Dyer and Charles Fielder of the third part.
- b) To a Doorway rent of Twenty Five pence per annum payable to the Mayor, Alderman and Citizens of the City of Bath.

The name Marlborough was derived from the stream that ran nearby. The stream was known as the Muddlebrook, the Mud Brook or the Mad Brook.

In 1590, Elizabeth I granted a Charter to Bath in which the Mad Brook is mentioned in delineating boundaries.

The name became corrupted to Marlborough Lane. The brook no longer exists.

"An assessment for the necessary relief of the poor and for the purposes in the several Acts of Parliament relating to the poor of the Parish of Walcot in the County of Somerset being three rates at two pence in the pound each rate made and assessed by order of Vestry 14th day of September 1791."

1 John André prob born Paris on 2 May 175l the son of Anthony and Marie-Louise André nee Girardot

His father was a merchant residing in later life at Clapton, London; he died there on l4th April 1769 aged 52 and was buried in the family vault in St Augustine's churchyard, Hackney. His mother died in Bath on 22nd February 1813 aged 91.

John Andre had one brother, William Lewis, and three sisters. William was baptised at St Martin Outwich in London on 25th November I760 and was later made a baronet by George III in honour of the memory of his brother. He died unmarried in I802 and the title became extinct.

The sisters lived in Bath and all died unmarried

Ann Marguerite in 1830, Louisa Catherine in 1835 and Mary Hannah in 1845.

In the Nave of Westminster Abbey there is a monument to Major John André, executed as a spy by the Americans in 1780. Designed by Robert Adam and carried out by Peter Mathias Van Gelder it was erected at the expense of King George III. It shows a mourning figure of Britannia with a lion, seated on the top of a sarcophagus. On the front of this is a relief showing George Washington in a tent receiving a petition and Major André being led away to execution.

#### The inscription reads:

Sacred to the Memory of Major John Andre, who raised by his Merit at an early period of Life to the rank of Adjutant General of the British Forces in America, and employed in an important but hazardous Enterprise fell a Sacrifice to his Zeal for his King and Country on the 2nd of October AD I780 Aged 29, universally Beloved and esteemed by the Army in which he served and lamented even by his Foes. His gracious Sovereign King George the Third has caused this Monument to be erected.

# Major Andre's Description of the Mischianza. An Endnote to Chapter IV "Philadelphia, May 23, 1778

Lord Cathcart, superbly mounted on a managed horse, appeared as chief of these knights; two young black slaves, with sashes and drawers of blue and white silk, wearing large silver clasps round their necks and arms, their breasts and shoulders bare, held his stirrups. On his right hand walked Captain Hazard, and on his left Captain Brownlow, his two esquires, one bearing his lance, the other his shield. His device was Cupid riding on a lion; the motto, Surmounted by Love. His lordship appeared in honor of thiss Auchmuty"

Have been doing a bit of investigation re Louisa Giradot. Louisa is listed in the rate books from 1802 onwards as Giradot and in the Bath Directory of 1812 as Mrs Giradot, 19 Marlborough Buildings.

However, the rate book entry for 1819 lists her as Louisa Girardot and the 1829 burials register of Bath Abbey has the following entry:

8 Jan Girardot Louisa, Marlborough Bldgs, Walcot aged 87. Also the following inscription in Bath Abbey:

Louisa Girardot relict of the late Tillieux Girardot Esq. died January 1st 1829 aged 87 years.

Seems Giradot and Girardot are interchangeable. Tried putting Louisa Girardot Tillieux in Google and came up with some interesting hits especially 'The Baronetage of England: or the History of the English Baronets - 1804' which appears to give Louisa's family connections - but unfortunately my computer couldn't take it and froze before any info could be downloaded! Hadn't realised before that Louisa married into the Girardot family.

The info regarding the Girardots as being bankers and owning property in Bath came from my next door neighbour here in Guinea Lane. He had done a bit of research on his house (no. 17) and had also sent me the following:
