

William Somerville Ahmuty

This is the last Will and Testament of me William Somerville A'hmuty of Henton in the parish of Wookey in the county of Somerset gentleman. All my real and personal estate and effects whatsoever and wheresoever I give devise and bequeath unto Mary Ann Peach of Henton aforesaid widow her heirs executors and administrators and assigns according to the nature and tenure thereof respectively And I appoint the said Mary Ann Peach sole executrix of this my Will and hereby revoking all Wills by me heretofore made declare this to be my last

In witness whereof I the said William Somerville A'hmuty the testator have hereunto set my hand this sixth day of 6th June 1867 - Wm Somerville A'hmuty - signed by the said William Somerville A'hmuty the testator as and for his last Will and Testament in the presence of us who at his request in his presence and in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses H K Sheppard, solicitor, Wells. E J Richards his clerk

Proved at Wells the 16th day of February 1871 by the oath of Mary Ann Peach, widow, the sole executrix named in the Will to whom administration was granted.

The testator William Somerville A'hmuty was late of Henton in the parish of Wookey in the county of Somerset gentleman and died on the 11th day of December 1870 at Henton aforesaid.

Under £2,000 Extracted by S Hobbs solicitor Wells

On the sixteenth day of 16th February 1871 the Will of William Somerville A'hmuty late of Henton in the parish of Wookey in the county of Somerset gentleman deceased who died on the eleventh day of December 1870 at Henton aforesaid was proved in the District Registry attached to Her Majesty's Court of Probate at Wells by the oath of Mary Ann Peach of Henton aforesaid widow the sole executrix therein named she having been first sworn duly to administer.

Sending as attach the will of William Somerville Ahmuty which have just received from the York Probate Office. The mystery deepens - what could be the relationship between William and Mary Ann Peach. In the book, Junkets and Jailbirds, the surname is spelt Ah'muty. In the will it is A'hmuty as was the daughter Elizabeth Frances A'hmuty when she married William Blackburrow in 1853.

Tried to search on Ancestry for the 1871 census for Somerset - there are quite a few listings for Mary Ann Peach but they don't give enough detail to know whos who.
