Francis Orpen Morris 1810-1893

naturalist, born at Cove, near Cork, on 25 March 1810, was the eldest son of Rear-admiral
Henry Gage Morris of York and Beverley, who served in the American and French wars.
His mother, Rebecca Newenham Millerd, was a daughter of the Rev. Francis Orpen. His
grandfather was Colonel Roger Morris [q. v.] Francis was educated at Bromsgrove School
and Worcester College, Oxford, where he graduated B. A., with honours in classics, in 1833.
He astonished his examiners by choosing Pliny's Natural History' for his voluntary thesis. He
was admitted ad eundem at Durham in 1844.
