Summary. Kilmore a parish in the barony of Ballintobber county of Roscommon and province of Connaught two miles from Drumsna on the road to Elphin. Near the shores of Lough Bodarig is Ballycommon formerly the seat of the Earl of Roscommon now occupied by Lieutenant Rodrick J. Hanly and to the north is Clooteen a handsome and newly built lodge belonging to the Marquess of Westmeath. A short canal crosses the edge of the Parish and between it and the river is Charlestown the seat of Sir Gilbert King Baronet beautifully situated in a richly embellished demesne and approached by a noble avenue of lime trees. Other seats include Kilmore House built 1630 that of A. A'hmuty M.D and Tully the seat of J. W. Kelly Esq. The living is a Rectory in the diocese of Elphin in the patronage of A. A'hmuty and J. W. Kelly Esquires representatives of the Lawder family, tithes amount to £200. The glebe house was built in 1828 by a loan of £360 and a gift of £369 from the late Board of First Fruits. The glebe comprises nine acres of meadow land held by the rector Rev R. Jones. Schools for boys and girls are aided by subscriptions collected by the rector. A loan fund has been established under the superintendence of A. A'hmuty which though of small extent has been very beneficial to the poor. The late Mr Lawder of this Parish bequeathed £20 per annum for clothing six poor men and six poor women.
