I also give and bequeath unto them £3000 3 per cent Consols in trust to give the dividends thereof to my faithful servant Benjamin Mathews during his life, at his death the said sum of £3,000 3 per cent Consols to be given to my nephew Capt. W Mulcaster R.N. or his heirs.

£3,000 Consols to be transferred to Frederick Mulcaster (called in the Will Colonel Frederick Mulcaster), Richard Tylden and Osborne Tylden, the devisees in trust and left at their disposal.

£21,900 Consols £1,000 Bank Stock are at the disposal of Richard Tylden, Thomas Gage Montresor (in the Will written Thomas Montresor) and Sir John Maxwell Tylden, knight (in the Will written Sir John Tylden, knight) the acting executors.

## Copy of a Memorial from Lieut. Auchmuty the original forward to Sir A Campbell 7th March 1787

To the Right Hon'ble Lieutenant General Earl Cornwallis Commander in Chief etc

The Memorial of Lieutenant Samuel Auchmuty of his Majesty's 52<sup>nd</sup> Regiment

Humbly sheweth

That your Memorialist officiated as Judge advocate on the trial of the late Major General Sir John Burgoyne, Baronet, in obedience to the orders of Lieutenant General Sloper, then Commander in Chief

That no allowance whatever has been made him for his services on that trial

That some months after it was brought to a conclusion, and the copies ordered by the Commander in Chief were completed, application was made to Lieutenant General Sir John Dalling for payment, your Memorialist stating that he had advanced 198 Pagodas to the writers he had been obliged to employ and that he computed the additional expense he incurred at the Presidency during and after the trial at 200 Pagodas independent of any allowance for his services

That in compliance with the advice of the Commander in Chief on the Coast, a memorial was presented to Lieutenant General Sloper stating these particulars and praying a reinbursement, but that your Memorialist has not hitherto received an answer

Thus circumstanced, he humbly begs leave to solicit that your Lordship will take the prayer of this memorial into your consideration and he is the more induced to hope you will be pleased to order a remittance equal to the nature of the service and the expense he of necessity incurred as an authenticated copy for the President in Council at Fort St. George has recently been ordered to be made out
